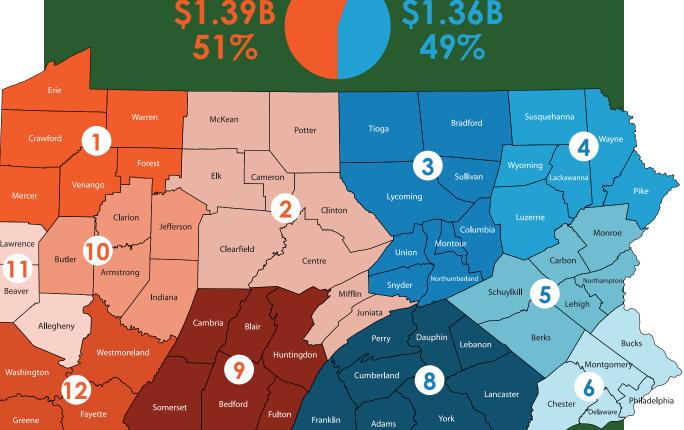

Last year, CAWP noted the significant imbalance in PennDOT lettings, with eastern Pennsylvania receiving a much greater share of funding compared to the west: eastern PA having received \$1.7B or 67% versus western PA's portion of \$883M or 33%. Recognizing that both regions have pressing infrastructure needs, CAWP has been advocating for a more equitable distribution of funds across the Commonwealth. This year, as you will see from the following chart, PennDOT's lettings have been more balanced between east and west.
